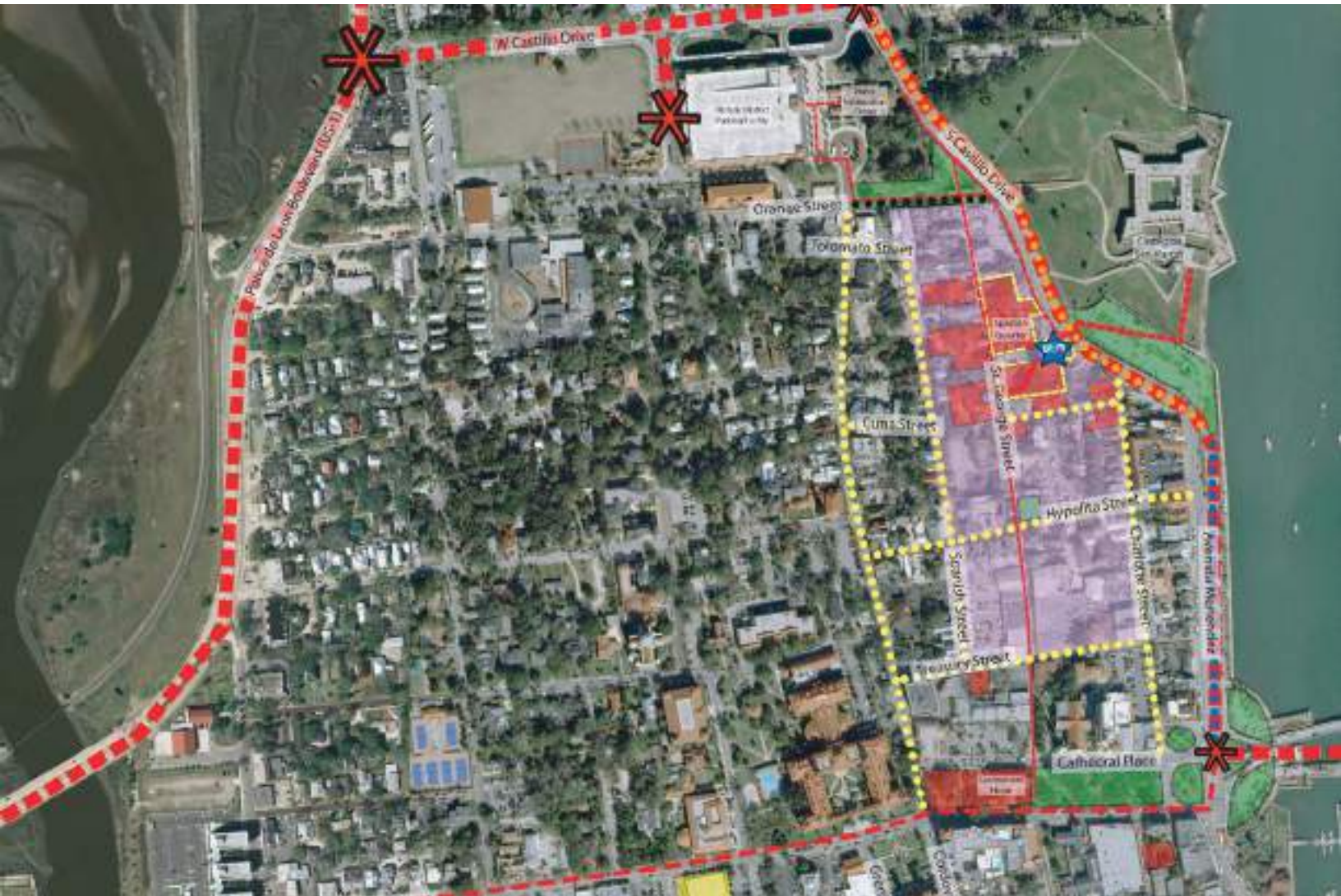
The final design focused on solving modern urban challenges, where issues like traffic and pedestrian circulation were addressed within the most appropriate historic context.

# Colonial Quarter

## *Experience Centuries of St. Augustine*

ASLA, Florida Chapter, Award of Honor – Preservation & Conservation



Marquis Latimer + Halback, Inc. worked for nearly two years with Pat Croce & Company and the University of Florida to transform approximately 2 acres of downtown St. Augustine into an interpretive, immersive environment that tells the story of the Nation's Oldest City.

Four quadrants transport visitors from the founding of St. Augustine in the 16th century to the 18th century British period, when Florida was the "14th Colony." ADA-accessible coquina pathways pass through period gardens, while quadrant-specific lighting, fencing, and buffers help each quadrant to feel like a separate experience.

# UF Governor's House

## *Renovating the Heart of the City*



Rooted in the heart of historic St. Augustine, Government House is a landmark and tourist destination in the city. Partnering with several entities, such as the Institute for Food Agricultural Sciences (IFAS) and the Board of Directors, Marquis Latimer + Halback, Inc. has developed a comprehensive landscape and hardscape improvement plan for the site.

ML+H has incorporated historically appropriate plant species and native materials, celebrating the historic evolution of the site. ML+H was also challenged with redesigning the existing courtyard to provide an updated first impression. Currently used as an event space, ML+H has organized the courtyard with a series of cut coral pavers and coquina concrete, accented with terra cotta planters and an improved landscape. Additionally, the historic fountain has been re-envisioned to reflect the Flagler-era landscapes aesthetic.

# UWF Historic Trust Museum Plaza

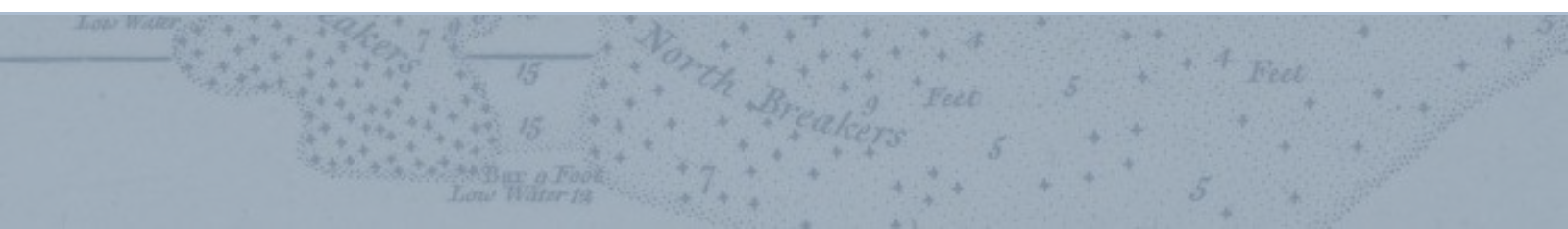

# Reconnecting the Castillo & the Bayfront

## *Improving Visitor Connections*



In preparation for the 450th anniversary of the Nation's Oldest City, and funded by the Paul S. Sarbanes Transit in Parks Grant, Marquis Latimer + Halback, Inc. provided planning and design services to improve the visitor connections to the historic Castillo de San Marcos, Downtown, and Bayfront.

Leading an unprecedented public participation program, including public meetings, surveys, and a heavily visited project website, a multi-phased implementation strategy was developed.

Thorough consensus building and coordination with the City, FDOT, FTA, and the National Park Service has resulted in continued grant support for the planning and implementation. Projects resulting from this study include: SRA1A Transportation Management, Historic Downtown Streetscape Guidelines, 450<sup>th</sup> Transit Study, and the Historic Downtown Parking Study.

Marquis Latimer + Halback, Inc. produced the “Historic Downtown Streetscape Guidelines” for the city of St. Augustine. These guidelines were adopted and implemented as part of the *Downtown Improvements District*; a \$2.8 million streetscape project for Spanish Street, Hypolita Street, and Treasury Street.

The improvements include full replacement of underground sewer and water lines, new cable and electric conduit, new gas lines, and a new stormwater drainage system seamlessly integrated into the brick streets above.

ML+H utilizing ‘complete streets’ techniques, designed new brick streets, flush curbs, coquina concrete sidewalks, street lights, street trees and other historic elements into ‘pedestrian friendly’ connectors. This project has received awards from the ASLA (Florida Chapter), Florida Trust for Historic Preservation, and others. The Oldest Street in America, Aviles Street, is part of the original city plan, developed by Spanish Royal decree around 1573. Although the street was rich in history and charm, many tourists (and even local residents) did not know of its existence.

# Orange Street Pedestrian + Vehicular Improvements

*A Clear Pedestrian Entrance*



Marquis Latimer + Halback, Inc. has secured over \$1.4 million dollars of grant funds for planning and implementation for the City of St. Augustine through the FTA 'Transit in Parks' program.

Phase II consists of a \$680,000 streetscape project on Orange Street. The roadway connects the Multi-Modal Transportation Facility at the Visitor Information Center to the City Gates, the Castillo de San Marcos and the main pedestrian roadway, St. George Street.

A new brick street and extension of the historic '*Cubo Line*' visually connects the historic destinations, while an expanded trolley drop off, bicycle racks, and delivery zone supports multiple users in this living city.

With the community's support, St. Augustine was able to successfully complete this multi-modal, 1,100 car garage facility. The project provides a focal point and anchor for visitors and residents while creating an organized arrival experience adjacent to the historic downtown.

Located at the base of the Main Street Bridge in downtown Jacksonville, the Chamber of Commerce headquarters has transformed into a progressive, forward-looking urban landscape.

Multi-functional gathering spaces and plazas surround the property, while a contemporary landscape of native plant material, colorful video wall, sculpture garden, and plaza of international flags enliven the experience.

The JAX Chamber redesign includes a city block of urban parks and a new multi-purpose sustainable parking area with bio-filtration systems for stormwater treatment.

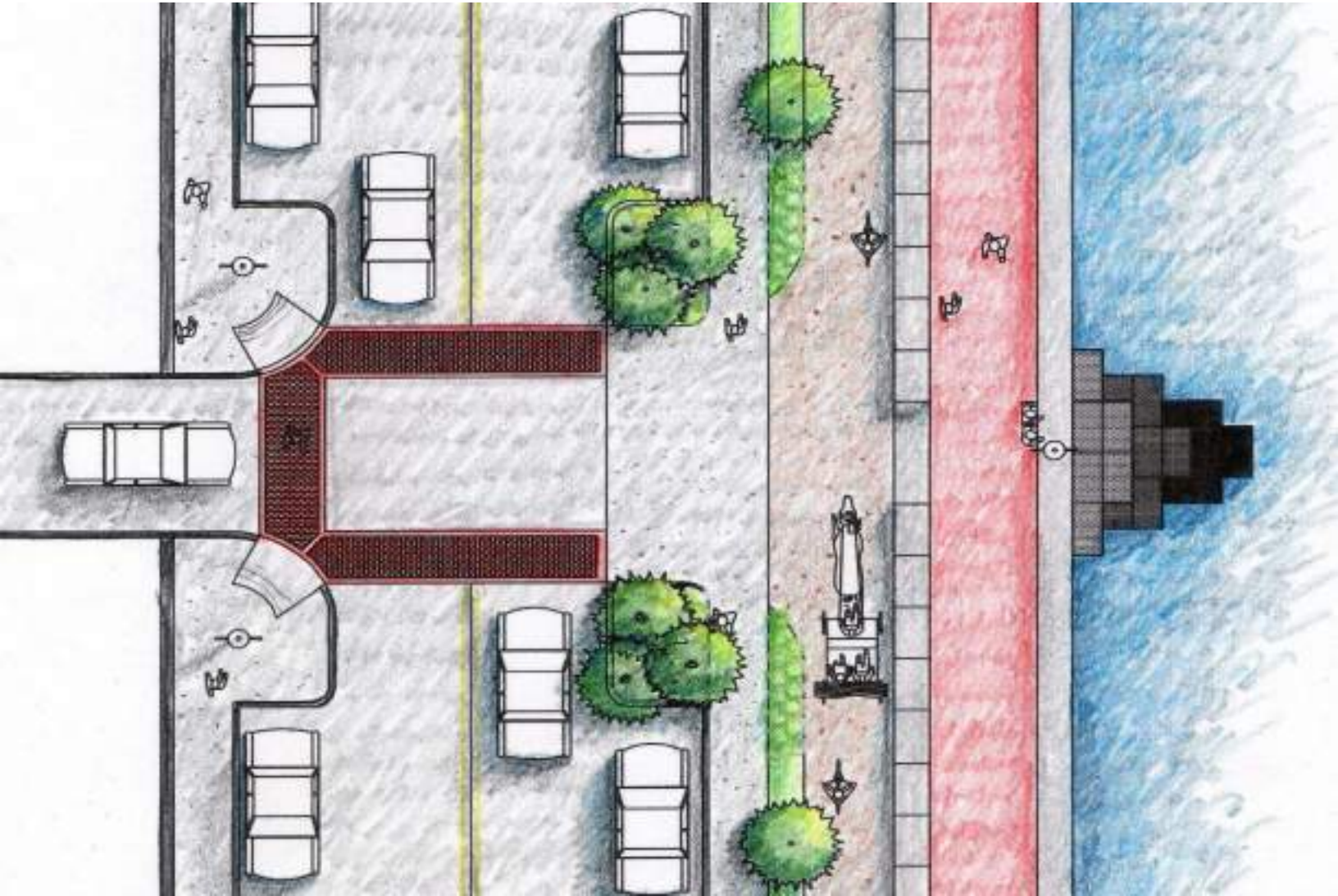

# Matanzas Seawall Rehabilitation

*Preserving Yesterday, Protecting Tomorrow*

The Seawall Reconstruction Project is a result of tropical storm and hurricane damage to the historic seawall built in 1833 by West Point cadet engineers.

Marquis Latimer + Halback, Inc. was hired to determine the feasibility of this flood control project. Duties included researching pertinent issues, synthesizing the information into easily understandable graphics and reports, and presenting it to citizens in a series of carefully planned public meetings and design workshops.

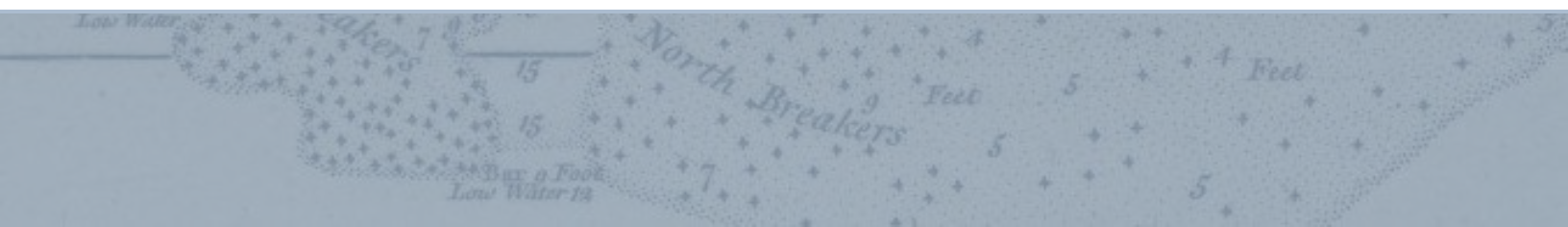

The site is sculpted into live coastal oaks and includes an interpretive arboretum.
